Stillaguamish Valley Pioneer Museum

The museum preserves the heritage of the Stillaguamish River Valley with logging and sawmill displays, a model railroad, animal mounts & more. Celebrate Pioneer Days the 3rd Sat in September at the museum. Hands on activities from the past.

- Little League baseball fields at Bill Quake Memorial Park and W.E. Evans Ballfield. Located at corner of 59th Ave and 188th St.
- Arlington Skate Park located at Quake Park.
- Terrace Park (809 E Fifth St) Play equipment, sport court, picnic shelter, restrooms, and stage.
- Haller Park (1100 West Ave) River access, play equipment, restrooms, and picnic shelter.
- Jensen Park (7801 Jensen Farm Ln) Play equipment and picnic shelter.
- York Park. Just off of Smokey Point Blvd. on 180th St. Play equipment and sport court.
- Legion Park (114 N Olympic Ave) Olympic Ave.
- Pioneer Park (Stillaguamish Valley Museum) Three ponds, home to wildlife.



- Shop for antiques, collectibles, crafts, gifts, home decor, clothing, pet supplies, quilting materials, sporting goods, gardening supplies, hardware and much more...

- Shop for fresh produce at the Arlington Farmers Market at Legion Park on Saturdays June-Sept.

- Walk around the historic residential district.

- Dine at one of the several cafes and restaurants for breakfast, lunch or dinner: American, Mexican, Thai and upscale Northwest cuisine.

- Enjoy the art and flowers at City Hall.

- Stop at the Veterans Memorial in Legion Park to read the names of Arlington residents who have served in military services.



- Note the humor of Arlington's Centennial Time Capsule celebrating history with a tree trunk and milk can.



- Walk, bike, or skate the Centennial Trail through downtown and beyond, from the Stillaguamish River all the way to Lake Stevens and Snohomish to the south. And soon to the north to Skagit County.



- Swing under the trees in Terrace Park & at the edge of the river at Haller Park.

- Watch for the sculptures and murals along the Centennial Trail and around town, and visit the fountain in Centennial Park on Division Street.


- Walk across the river to Twin Rivers Park to explore the confluence of the two forks of the Stillaguamish River where the modern history of Arlington began more than 140 years ago.

- Watch for critters at the Portage Creek Wildlife area, 59th Ave off of SR 530.


