The State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) and the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) has been provided with documentation regarding the above referenced project. In response, we concur with the results and recommendations made in the survey report entitled "Cultural Resources Assessment of the Seattle Galvanizing Small Parts and Storage Project, Arlington, Snohomish County, Washington," and specifically agree with the recommendations on Page 30 (7.0 Conclusions and Recommendations) of the report. [REDACTED] Therefore, a DAHP Permit must be applied for and granted to the project prior to ground disturbing activities.

We also recommend continued consultation with the concerned Tribes' cultural committees and staff regarding cultural resource issues.

These comments are based on the information available at the time of this review and on behalf of the SHPO in conformance with Washington State law. Should additional information become available, our assessment may be revised.
