Hello,

I would like to formally request that the decision to install a Hot dip galvanization processing plant at the entrance of the Gleneagle neighborhood be reversed.

I live on Sprucewood Place in the Gleneagle neighborhood, which is very close to the entrance of Gleneagle at 67th Ave, right where this proposed plant is apparently going to be installed. I have very serious concerns about the effects of inhalation of fumes produced by the plant, including inhalation of lead, zinc, and other dangerous chemicals/substances that are known to cause serious health problems. This includes cancer.

The proximity of this plant is ALARMINGLY close to where I live, so I would like to know why this proposal is being considered or has been approved; I was not clear from the mailing I received on whether this is actually approved or not.

I am interested to know whether any environmental or health studies have been completed related to this specific plant installation's proximity to so many people's homes. My hope is that the city will not approve such a disturbing decision.
