Hi Amy and Arlington Planning Commission and City Council –

My husband, Jack Shouman, and I are opposed to the City of Arlington's allowing the establishment of a hot-dip galvanizing process plant at 18520 67th Avenue, which is across the street from not only the Gleneagle housing development (where I live) but also to the residential apartment complex being constructed at the corner of 67th and Woodlands Blvd, as well as residents in Arlington Terrace, where my husband and I own property and are building a house, and several other residential developments on the east side of 67<sup>th</sup> Avenue in the vicinity of the proposed establishment. As is well known, the toxic fumes produced by the hot-dip galvanization process constitute health hazards; this type of process should not be allowed in close proximity to residential developments. Please do not approve this proposed process plant at or near its proposed location.
