Amy Rusko , I am a resident of Arlington and it has been brought to my attention that a proposal has been submitted to the City of Arlington to establish a hot dip galvanizing process plant at 18520 67th Ave, right at the entrance of the Glenn Eagle residential area. As you may know; Hot dip galvanization produces toxic fumes. Inhalation of these fumes can lead to long-term health problems, as the process can cause both lead and zinc from the galvanized steel to vaporize. Exposure to lead is particularly dangerous and is known to cause numerous serious health issues, including cancer. The proximity of the proposed plant to the Glenn Eagle residences is alarming. This location is unsuitable for metal chemical processing activities, especially given its placement in the heart of a residential area. I am requesting that this plan be reconsidered and ultimately declined. K. Burow
