Hi Amy,

I recently received a flyer in my mail regarding a hot dip galvanizing process plant that is soon to be located at 18520 67th Ave. This flyer advises that hot dip galvanizing produces toxic fumes, which could lead to long term health issues including but not limited to cancer and impacts of lead exposure. This flyer also advises that we contact you should we be concerned about this.

My main concern is for my children since we live close to where this plant will be located. However I am also concerned for those that use the trail for walking/biking, for the children who play outside to west of the proposed location at the boys and girls club and parks, and for the people who live north of the location in mobile estates as they may not know of this plant and it's potential to cause damages.

I'd like to know if there has been any risk or health assessment done and if there is any truth to what this flyer is claiming? I'd also like to know how this company plans on limiting their air pollution so it doesn't adversely affect our children and loved ones?

It seems unfair that children especially, should be limited to outdoor playtime and locations of that playtime to accommodate a business when they should perhaps look to another area that is not so active or hugely populated.

As an Arlington citizen, if there is any truth to these claims at all then I would like to ask our city to please take our concerns seriously. And please take into consideration our health and potential for long term affect that would have an impact on an already overburdened healthcare system as well as the affect it could have on continued tourism and population growth.
