This message came from outside the City of Arlington

TO: City of Arlington Community & Economic Development Department

I have been told by someone close to City of Arlington government, that the CED has expressed opposition to this proposed facility and the hazards it poses for our community.

I hope my source provided valid information.

This galvanizing plant will be detrimental to our city and the location is too close to residential homes and apartments on the East side of 67th Ave.

The applicant admits that less than 100% of hazardous particles, fumes and contaminants will be removed and that is dependent upon all filtering systems working properly. In spite of these systems it is estimated that approximately **28 lbs of hazardous materials per month** will be emitted into the air from this processing site. This should be unacceptable not only to residents but other nearby industrial firms. How can this be permitted. What City Departments will monitor this hazardous operation and is the City of Arlington prepared for possible chemical spills and fire? Will

the City be liable for health and environment issues? Will our ground water be affected from fall out?

Approximately 200 people have sent Amy Rusko email comments opposing this permit and the hearing will be by ZOOM at 10 AM tomorrow.
