It's Road Construction Season!

Utility and Pavement Preservation Projects:

The City of Arlington will be continuing to upgrade its waterlines and resurface roadways in Arlington during the summer. This will include replacement of old waterlines followed by repaving of selected roadways, as well as updates to ADA pedestrian crossing ramps.

Pavement projects:

- 195th Street NE
- Woodbine Drive
- S. Cedarbough Loop
- 204th Street from 67th Street to 69th Street

Waterline Improvement projects:

- 195th Street NE
- 66th Avenue NE

204th Street/ 74th Avenue Signal Project:

Shoulder work and utility relocations this summer. Traffic signal poles will be ordered, but installation will not be until after summer, due to long lead times.

State Route 530 Roundabouts at 59th Avenue & 211th Street:

The City is working with the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) on the installation of roundabouts at 59th Avenue and at 211th Place. Construction of these two single lane roundabouts will increase safety and mobility on SR 530. Construction this summer!
